HyperMED Precaution And Safety Requirements

You will be receiving 100% pure Oxygen whilst undertaking Hyperbaric Oxygenation (HBOT) at HyperMED

Increased risk of fire can be associated with elevated levels of Oxygen. You cannot smoke inside a HBOT chamber

You will be required to wear appropriate clothing preferably made out of 100% cotton

You will be provided disposable - covering gown, hat and feet covers

You will be required to purchase your own mask

You are required to minimise makeup, hair oil, hair spray etc – no heavy make-up

You are required to minimize jewellery - take off your watch, neck-lace and wrist bracelets etc

You cannot take inside the chamber mobile phones or electronic games

You are to minimise unnecessary items inside the chamber – remember another patient follows after you

You must eat before and after chamber sessions – your body is physiologically working and requires fuel

What You Need To Know About Smoking

The purpose of Hyperbaric Oxygenation is to deliver high doses of concentrated Oxygen to your body through your blood. Smoking inhibits Oxygen delivery and inhibits Oxygen uptake by the lungs. Nicotine in cigarettes narrows the diameter of the blood vessels (vasoconstriction), reducing both blood and oxygen that potentially reaches your tissues

Smoking increases lung congestion and the risk of complications

Smoking directly impacts the ability of brain and spinal cord regeneration

If you suffer chronic circulatory or chronic pain syndromes or failed back surgery – stop smoking!
